THE WHITE HOUSE

I PROTEST THE SUPREME COURT'S NEW STATEMENT THAT SEGREGATION WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE UNITED STATES. I AS A CITIZEN WOULD LIKE TO STAND ON THE PLATFORM THAT THE SIGNERS AT LEAST 20 PERCENT OF THE SIGNERS OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE WERE AS OF THAT TIME SLAVE OWNERS AND DID NOT LOOK ON NEGROES AS FAR AS I AM CONCERNED HUMAN BEINGS SO

THEREFORE I RESENT THE FACT THAT YOU THE PRESIDENT OR THE SUPREME COURT OF JUSTICE WOULD TRY TO FORCE DOWN THE THROAT OF A WHITE MAN THAT INADVERTENTLY SUPPOSEDLY THOUGHT AT ONE TIME THAT HE WAS FIGHTING FOR THE SUPREMACY OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA SO I WILL NOW STAND FORWARD AND FORTHWITH AGAINST ANY SHOVING DOWN THE THROATS OF A HEDGAR AGAINST A GENTILE BECAUSE I BELIEVE HE IS BEING SUPPORTED BY THE JENS OF THE FORERUNNERS OF AN IGNORANT SOCIETY I AM A MAN 32 YEARS OF AGE WHO NEVER BEFORE IN HIS LIFE VOTED BEFORE YOU PRESIDENT

EISENHOWER WERE ELECTED BECAUSE I THOUGHT THAT YOU MR PRESIDENT WERE A MAN TO BE RESPECTED AND HONORED. IF YOU MR PRESIDENT STAND ABOVE A WHITE PERSON IN ALL GLORIFICATION AND ABSOLUTION DISRESPECTING ALL THE RIGHTS FEELINGS HUMAN PERSONALITIES OF THE INDEPENDENT VOTER THEN ALL I CAN SAY FOR YOU IS GO TO. AND I WILL FIGHT WITH MY OWN BODY IF NECESSARY THE FLAGRAANT INATTENTION OF THE VOTER THAT PUT YOU WHERE YOU ARE. I DARE YOU TO CHANGE MY MIND
